



Spring Garden News

The warmer weather means we are currently busy planting foxgloves around the gardens, plus gladioli have been planted once again in our veg' plot which will be cut and used by our florists during the summer to make beautiful displays.

We have also planted 12 x 20 meter rows of potatoes and 50 in bags. We are in the process of picking rhubarb, parsley, coriander and lambs lettuce to be used in our kitchen.

Our bedding plants are doing very well and will create our fabulous hanging baskets and tubs.

Also on our ever growing list of 'things to do' we have the sowing of our runner-beans, climbing French beans and snap peas which will join the basil, spinach, nasturtiums, cabbage, lettuce and courgettes that have already been sown earlier this year.

We are looking forward to the sweet peas being ready for picking and we are looking to plant a selection of shrubs and perennials around the garden to replace the ones lost throughout our very snowy winter!

We have also finally received our new shredder to allow us to compost our cardboard and garden waste to help nourish our plantings.
